TRANSPORT

Our day-to-day life is busy with a number of activities, which involves movement to and from different places. For this movement we need to use different modes of transport. For some 'real world, hands-on' learning about Transport, the children of the Pre-Primary Wing (PN, NUR & KG) were taken outside the school gate, to see the Zebra Crossing, the footpath and the movement of different vehicles on the road. Children learnt about how and when to cross the road (by using a Zebra Crossing), using a footpath for walking and other Road & Traffic Safety Rules.

The children of Kindergarten also learnt about some road signs and what they mean, through an activity set up in Atrium 2. Through this integrated activity, they also learnt about the pre-number concept of wide & narrow by walking through narrow and wide roads (created with big wooden blocks). They understood what the three different colours of the traffic light mean and its relevance. It was a great learning experience for our little Shreeyans.













TEACHERS' DAY

Teachers' Day is celebrated in India on 5th September every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. Pre-Primary Shreeyans celebrated this day with great gusto and gaiety. The day started with 'Guru Vandana' followed by a peek into Dr Radharkrishan's life and why Teacher's Day is celebrated. The Shreeyans made cards to express their love, respect and gratitude for their teachers with special artwork using handprints, oil-pastels etc. Kindergarten Shreeyans surprised their teachers by performing for them - rhymes, songs, acting like teachers etc. Shreegurus and Shreeyans danced together creating fun memories to cherish forever.

















GANDHI JAYANTI

Gandhi Jayanti is celebrated on 2nd October every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. He is known as the 'Father of the Nation' and fondly called 'Bapu'. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, as is the custom at Gyanshree, an all-faith prayer was conducted in the school followed by a Swatchhta (Cleaning) Activity by all Shreeyans in different parts of the school. The Shreeyans of the Pre-Primary Wing also participated in the 'Clean-Up Activity' by cleaning their classes with much enthusiasm and eagerness. On this occasion the Shreeyans also did Art & Craft activities - Pre-Nursery made Gandhiji's spectacles by pasting shape cut-outs; Shreeyans of Nursery had a colouring sheet of the three monkeys through which they learnt about the value 'बुरा मत बोलो', 'बुरा मत देखो' and 'बुरा मत सोचो'. The Shreeyans of Kindergarten made a 'charkha'. Values that Gandhi ji believed in have relevance even today and are recognized the world over.

















PEOPLE WHO HELP US

At Gyanshree we believe in discovering the joy of learning through activities connected to the real world. The theme for the month of October, was 'People Who Help us'. A 'Community Helpers Walk' was organized in the school. Our Shreeyans saw and met various helpers working in the school - teacher, nanny, cleaning staff, guard, doctor, nurse, driver, helper, mechanic, gardener, carpenter, electrician, plumber. The Shreeyans also met few members of the school administration – accountant, transport in-charge, vice principal, principal etc., spoke to them, and learnt about their role in the school. They thanked various helpers by giving them 'Thank You' cards. They made a special 'Thank You' card for their class didi to express their gratitude for all that she does to help them.

A Dress-Up Activity was also conducted in which the Shreeyans were dressed as various community helpers that they had learnt about or see around them. They spoke about who they were dressed as, and also carried their tools as props. This activity enhanced their language skills and helped them to showcase their talent.





DETAILED ASSESSMENT

The Shreeyans of Grade VI to X appeared for the first cycle of the Detailed Assessment in English, Hindi, Maths, Science and Social Studies. Detailed Assessment by Educational Initiatives is a formative assessment programme that helps teachers forecast and support student's performance in school annual exams, external competitive exams and board exams. After each test, the Detailed Assessment Student Report highlights the specific and critical learning gaps that should be addressed before moving on to the next topic. Teachers are able to identify and group students as per their needs and offer the required remedial support. The thought provoking questions help students develop critical thinking skills. The DA tests benefit both educators and students and the real time data helps analyse class and individual progress.

INTER-HOUSE HINDI DEBATE COMPETITION

They have also revived the concept of plantation through **seed-balls** in India.

Mrs Mehra spoke about all these issues at length and left us with a lot of food for thought. She has promised to conduct another workshop for students soon, where she will teach Shreeyans and Shreegurus how to make and plant seed-balls. Every little effort by each individual will surely make a significant impact and help to contain the damage caused to the environment in recent years.

Shreeyans of Grade VI to X appeared for ASSET, a skill-based test that measures students' conceptual understanding and benchmarks the school's performance at international, national and regional levels with actionable insights through easy-to-understand reports. The questions in the test are designed to measure a deeper, more critical understanding of skills and to promote higher-order thinking and inquiry. Based on a child's ASSET score, he/she might get invited for the higher-level test, ASSET Talent Search. ASSET also offers advanced programmes for gifted students.

OPEN HOUSE AT GYANSHREE The key to success is to focus on goals not obstacles.

A report card describes the level of academic achievement, life skills and social emotional growth that a student has shown over the course of a year. Open House was held at Gyanshree School and report cards and answer scripts were handed over to the parents to communicate to them how the child is doing academically, socially and their life skills. At Gyanshree, it is our endeavour that parents and teachers work together to groom our Shreeyans to succeed in life. Regular feedback and communication between parents and teachers is the only way we can help our children develop holistically and achieve their true potential.






EDUCATION WORLD SCHOOL RANKINGS 2022-23




- 3) Its historic sites include Golconda Fort; a former diamond-trading state established as an East India Company trading post, it was India's capital under the British Raj from 1773–1911.

- 10) Also known as 'Pink City' due to the red sandstone used in the construction of famous sites such as Hawa Mahal.





BOOK RECOMMENDATION ACROSS THE LINE BY NAYANIKA MAHTANI


"There is no Frigate like a book to take us lands away..."— Emily Dickinson

This historical fiction crosses borders to narrate the tale of two families who meet as a coincidence and recall some old connections while making new ones. Across the Line is a two sided narrative that begins with the small line of division on a map that divided India and Pakistan, and goes on to introduce several beautiful characters with their own outlook on the post partition years. It talks of dreams and passions and curiosities of young hearts and also the compassion, care and empathy for people with older, more experienced hearts.

It is a brilliant, thought provoking book with a few laughs along the way and a beautiful tribute to the survivors of the 1947 partition by the author who herself is quite familiar with their loss and pain. It bluntly talks about prejudices, hatred and countless avoidable errors of the human condition and shares the simple lesson of how it can all still be solved with love and acceptance of our differences. I would recommend this book to all those who are interested in a modern narrative of this massive historical incident through different perspectives from people belonging to both sides of the border, to people who would want to relate to young, open minded souls or even older ones with many beautiful teachings to spare.
