As you place yourself in the middle of a loud and crowded Delhi Market, and surround yourself with perspiring shoppers who beautifully balance overflowing sacks, spicy street food and exasperated children in their scarce amount of hands, you may find that competing with nearby vendors by shouting at the top of your lungs to spot your favourite shoe seller may not be as constructive as you might have previously imagined. However, quietly and patiently listening to the voices of the overwhelming bazaar to identify the cries of the trusty old seller may get you a brand-new pair of shoes. Here, actively trying to listen and absorb information available around us becomes an important step towards fulfilling our desires and goals.



BOOK RECOMMENDATION

Blink: The power of thinking without thinking By Malcolm Gladwell

Blink is a fascinating non-fiction narrative that hooks the reader from the very first chapter with engaging storytelling and valuable insights. The book talks about the processes underlying our spontaneous thinking and instinctive decisions, along with their importance, as well as how they can prove to be much more helpful in certain scenarios as opposed to long-drawn decision-making. This book is a refreshing change from prolonged and complicated non-fiction pieces of work with its interesting tone and simple elaborations of often confusing subjects. Each incident, example and metaphor in the book is brilliantly explained and referred to several times to explain seemingly complex topics about human instinct and behaviour in a graspable manner. It is a must-read for those interested in psychology and behaviour or those seeking knowledge about these topics for the first time, as it allows learning about the engrossing workings of the human unconscious and psychological research in a clear and intriguing way.
